Returned to the United States from Antwerp in June 1914. came to Chicago and employed by Fred Butterfield Co. of N.Y. Enlisted in March 1916 in 2nd Ill Infantry, I.R.S. served on the Mexican Border. Served in the race riots in East St. Louis, Ill in 1917 called to the color July 25th 1917.

in Forges, Woods  
enemy hit by shrapnel, sent Hospital  
Base 114 Bordeaux France. Stomach  
wound right over navel*

He advanced towards Bois du Forge  
where I was wounded, and received  
first aid in Field Hospital 129.  
and was sent to Bordeaux in Base  
114. Rejoined my division early  
part of November, and was put in  
charge of an outpost. Went out  
on a fighting patrol on night of  
Nov. 6, and captured 17 prisoners  
in Troyon sur Meuse sector. In action  
till Armistice day. Nov. 19. sent to school  
at Gondrecourt to study Grenades, and  
Automatic rifle. I was also an instructor on  
Stokes Trench Mortar. Served in the Army  
of Occupation. Stationed in Luxembourg.  
Left for the States  
in April 1919. Arrived here in  
May from Port of Brest on U.S.S. Mount  
Vernon. Discharged May 31<sup>st</sup> 1919.
