REMARKS—Commanding Officer of Troops will note in detail, quantity and quality of food, accommodations for troops, sanitary condition, damage to ship's property, deaths, and any information that will be of benefit for future voyages.

Note 1—The denomination of each Chaplain must be shown.
 Note 2—All personnel except officers will be included in Column 20.

- Under Column 3 will be entered name of organization, e. g., regiment, company or detachment, and whether same is complete or not. The unit designation to be prefixed by the word detachment. The troops will be entered in the following order:
 (a) Division and Brigade Headquarters and Detachments.
 (b) Organizations in their order.
 (c) Casual Officers and Detachments.
 (d) Casual Enlisted Detachments.
- Casuals should be grouped into detachments according to their destination—France or England.
 Under Column 4 and 5 will be entered the permanent personnel of organization; commissioned and enlisted, other than those for whom special provision is made under separate headings, i. e., Medical, Dental, Ordnance, Veterinary, Chaplains, Army Field Clerks, Civilian Employees, Male and Female.
- If units or detachments are not for duty with A. E. F., France, a special footnote should show whether for A. E. F., England, or with British, either in England or France.
- On the reverse side of the return will be entered the name, rank, army or staff corps and item number of all commissioned personnel grouped according to their destination in order given in Paragraph 1. All casual officers of the same branch or service and designated by the same item number will be listed together.
- Item numbers, if any, will be placed in Column 1. See passenger list for item numbers.
- Item number of units or detachments belonging to a division is always the number of the division.
- Add additional sheets if necessary.
