Historical Introduction

During the year 1911 the condition of disorder and revolution which had characterized the Republic of Mexico for a number of years began to assume grave proportions and became the cause of considerable friction between that country and the United States of America. President Diaz, who had ruled Mexico for a number of years, resigned May 25, 1911, and was soon succeeded by Francisco Madero, who was assassinated February 22, 1913. General Victoriano Huerta then usurped the office of President, and the relations between the two countries became more strained. President Wilson refused to recognize the Huerta Government. A party of U. S. Marines from the gunboat "Dolphin" was arrested by the Mexicans at Tampico April 10, 1914. The United States, on April 21, 1914, occupied Vera Cruz with an American force.

General Huerta was forced to resign July 15, 1914, after which Venustiano Carranza, a former cabinet member under President Madero, assumed control and was recognized as the de facto President in 1915 by the United States and other powers. Meanwhile Francisco Villa, a rebel leader, who had supported Madero, became a strong factor in the war against the Huerta regime. He soon quarreled with General Obregon, the leader of the Carranza forces, declared himself dictator of the North and renounced the Carranza movement. He also became hostile toward the United States because at one time he had a desire to be recognized as the President instead of Carranza.

Thus the disorder along the border continued. American property owners residing in Mexico were warned to leave. The destruction of American life and property in that country increased. These general conditions were unchanged until General Villa and his bandits made a raid on the camp of the 13th U. S. Cavalry and the town of Columbus, New Mexico, on the night of March 9, 1916. Steps were then taken for punitive action and an expeditionary force consisting of about ten thousand soldiers under the command of Brigadier General John J. Pershing started in pursuit nine days after the raid. President Carranza had reluctantly consented to this action, but the Mexican people generally viewed it with suspicion. A large body of Mexican troops began to move northward toward the Rio Grande River. Confronted with this situation, President Wilson issued an order on June 18, 1916, mobilizing the National Guard of the United States for active service.

All Illinois troops, included in the call, reported for duty at their home stations on June 19, 1916. With the exception of the Fifth and Sixth Regiments of Infantry, they were then mobilized at Springfield, Illinois, and there mustered into Federal service. Orders were issued on June 21, 1916, by The Adjutant General of Illinois establishing a mobilization camp at Camp Dunne (State Fair Grounds) and Camp Lincoln, Springfield, Illinois. Brigadier General D. Jack Foster, Illinois National Guard, was placed in command.

The First Infantry Brigade composed of the First, Second and Seventh Regiments of Infantry; the Second Infantry Brigade composed of the Third, Fourth and Eighth Regiments of Infantry; the First Field Artillery; Company A, First Engineers; Company A, Signal Corps and Field Hospitals No. 1 and No. 2, entrained on consecutive days from June 28th to July 4th for San Antonio, Texas.

Upon arrival at destination, they were assigned to the Twelfth Provisional Division, commanded by Brigadier General Henry A. Greene, United States Army, with permanent station at Camp Wilson adjoining Fort Sam Houston. The First Illinois Cavalry entrained at Springfield on July 1st for Brownsville, Texas, where it took permanent station.

While at these stations several important practice marches were made. The troops from Camp Wilson went to Leon Springs, Landa Park (New Brunfels) and Austin. The First Illinois Cavalry operating from Brownsville as a base, went to Palo Alto Battlefield, Point Isabel and Selma. Except when on these marches, all organizations were engaged in field exercises, target practice, combat firing, maneuvers, and other activities incident to the highest type of intensive training.

Orders were received from the War Department on August 31, 1916, directing the Headquarters First Brigade, the First Illinois Infantry and the Second Illinois Infantry to proceed to Springfield, Illinois. Other Illinois organizations followed at intervals. The last to return was the Fourth Illinois Infantry.
